

IRAN

Where history comes alive

It's Iran, but not as you think you know it. Take a walk through the quieter side of the country as its past and present unite.

This journey through Iran will reveal more than mountain views and bazaar bargains.

Acquaint yourself with the real Iran as you travel through cities and villages following a path that will reveal Persia's history and culture.





Day 1 Tehran

Arrive in the capital and visit the National Museum of Iran, with its collections of artefacts from ancient times and treasures from the Islamic Era. Visit the vast 18th and 19th century Golestan Palace complex, as well as Tehran's impressive Grand Bazaar.

Overnight: Escan Alvand Hotel or similar

Day 2 Masuleh

On the way to Masuleh, a car-free mountain village, you'll visit Qaleh Rudkhan, a Seljuk-era walled fortress defending a steep, wooded spur of the Alborz Mountains. The tiny, stepped village of Masuleh, where the roofs of houses act as a path to higher ground, has existed for around a thousand years.

Overnight: Local guest house

Day 3 Masuleh

Enjoy a four-hour hike over the forest-covered mountains in Masuleh, finishing at your camping site by Shah Moalem Mountain.

Overnight: Camping

Day 4 Masuleh

Arise early for a day's trek through the thick forest landscape. Once you arrive at your riverside destination, you'll set up camp for the night.

Overnight: Camping

Day 5 Masal

An hour's walk will take you to the first village in Masal County, where you'll enjoy breakfast with the villagers. Continue trekking to Masal, the centre of the county. The rest of the day is at your leisure.

Overnight: Local guest house

Day 6 Kashan

On the way to Ardabil, pass the mountainous Asalem-Khalkhal Road, one of the most beautiful in Iran. When you get there, visit the Sheikh Safi mausoleum and shrine complex, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Drive to the airport to catch your flight to Tehran, where you'll be met and transferred to Kashan.

Overnight: Khaneh Irani or similar

Day 7 Esfahan

Visit Fin Garden, a 16th to 19th century classic Persian walled garden. Drive to Esfahan in the early afternoon, where you'll stroll around the great Naqsh-e Jahan Square (also called Imam Square) and visit the historical bridges where locals hang out after dark and practise their singing.

Overnight: Bekhradi Hotel or similar





Day 8 Esfahan

Esfahan is home to some of Iran's finest architecture. The nearby 17th century bazaar, filled iwth locals, is a masterpiece of urban design. Visit Julfa, the historic Armenian neighbourhood, which features churches that display a distinctive mix of Christian symbols and Iranian architectural style.

Overnight: Bekhradi Hotel or similar

Day 9 Shiraz

En route to Shiraz, visit Pasargadae, the first Achaemenid capital and home to the tomb of Cyrus the Great. If time allows visit Persepolis, one of Iran's most impressive pre-Islamic monuments before heading toward the necropolis of Naqsh-e Rustam, the burial place of Achaemenid emperors.

Overnight: Elysee Hotel or similar

Day 10 Shiraz

Shiraz is widely regarded as the cradle of Persian civilisation. Walk through one of the city's celebrated gardens and visit the tombs of the great Iranian poets Hafez and Saadi. Take an afternoon stroll in the city's covered Vakil Bazaar.

Overnight: Elysee Hotel or similar

Day 11 Departure

Today you will be transferred to the airport for your onward flight from Shiraz.
